Declaration of State of Emergency- COVID-19

It is recommended that the Village Council approve the attached resolution declaring a State of Emergency for Indian Creek Village due to COVID-19 ("Coronavirus").

The coronavirus is an acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through respiratory transmission. COVID-19 emerged in China, causing outbreaks that has now spread globally.

Upon the approval of this resolution, the Village Manager under this declared State of Emergency will be authorized to issue additional necessary restrictive measures to protect the health, safety, and welfare of Village residents.

RESOLUTION NO. 803

A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF INDIAN CREEK VILLAGE, FLORIDA, DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY DUE TO COVID-19/NOVEL CORONAVIRUS; AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE MANAGER TO ISSUE SUCH FURTHER ORDERS AS DEEMED NECESSARY TO PROTECT THE HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE OF THE VILLAGE RESIDENTS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Miami-Dade County Mayor Carlos Gimenez declared a local state of emergency related to COVID-19, which was extended on March 18, 2020; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 poses a health risk to the residents of Indian Creek Village, Florida (the "Village"), particularly elderly residents and those who are immunosuppressed or otherwise have high-risk medical conditions; and

WHEREAS, responding to the threat posed by COVID-19 may require extraordinary and immediate actions by the Village in order to protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council desires to declare a state of emergency due to COVID-19 effective as of 6:00 p.m. on March 23, 2020, that will be in effect until further notice, and authorizes the issuance of the Declaration of State of Emergency attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council recognizes that further orders may be needed and wishes to authorize the Village Manager to issue such emergency orders as deemed necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council desires to authorize the Village Manager to exercise the emergency powers set forth in Section 2-61 of the Village's Code of Ordinances, without further action of the Village Council; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council finds that there is a compelling governmental interest to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF INDIAN CREEK, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals Adopted. That each of the above-stated recitals are hereby adopted, confirmed, and incorporated herein.

Section 2. Declaration of State of Emergency. That the Village Council declares a state of emergency due to COVID-19 effective as of 6:00 p.m. on March 23, 2020, that will be in effect until further notice, and authorizes the issuance of the Declaration of State of Emergency attached hereto as Exhibit "A."

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Authorization.</u> That the Village Council hereby authorizes the Village Manager to issue such further emergency orders as deemed necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the Village residents, in accordance with Federal, State, and County laws, regulations, and orders, including but not limited to all powers under Chapter 252, F.S. Further, the Village Council authorizes the Village Manager to exercise the emergency powers set forth in Section 2-61 of the Village's Code of Ordinances, without further action of the Village Council.

Section 4. Enforcement. The Village Police Department is authorized to enforce the provisions of this Resolution, the Declaration, and any Orders issued pursuant thereto.

Section 5. Effective Date. That this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.

Pursuant to this Declaration, further orders may be issued to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the community.

Upon Council's approval of Resolution 803, declaring the State of Emergency for Indian Creek Village due to COVID-19 ("Coronavirus"); I hereby find it reasonable and necessary to restrict access to the Village in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of Village residents. The attached Emergency Order no. 20-01 identifies these access restrictions.

INDIAN CREEK VILLAGE, FLORIDA OFFICE OF THE VILLAGE MANAGER EMERGENCY ORDER NO. 20-01

On March 23, 2020, the Village Council declared a State of Emergency due to COVID-19/Novel Coronavirus. As Village Manager for Indian Creek Village, Florida, and pursuant to the authority vested under the declared State of Emergency due to COVID-19/Novel Coronavirus, as well as, in accordance with Section 252.38 of the Florida Statutes; I hereby declare the following order restricting access to the Village, which are reasonable and necessary in response to this State of Emergency (the "Order"):

- 1. <u>Residential Access.</u> Access by any means to the Village shall be limited to residential property owners/occupants, their immediate family members, guests (not more than 10 guests at any one time), residential employees/personnel and individuals performing property maintenance.
- Non-Residential Access-Indian Creek Country Club Access. Pursuant to Miami-Dade County
 Emergency Order No. 06-20, as amended, the Indian Creek Country Club closed. Therefore, all
 access by any means to the Village shall be limited to essential administrative, managerial, or
 maintenance personnel.
- 3. <u>Delivery/Transportation Services Personnel Access.</u> These access limitations shall not apply to delivery/transportation service personnel.
- 4. <u>Governmental Access</u>. These access limitations shall not apply to individuals providing essential government services including but not limited to Police and life safety personnel.
- 5. <u>Parking</u>. All vehicular parking shall be within each individual lot/ property. No off-site parking shall be permitted.

I further find that the provisions of this Emergency Order are narrowly tailored and the least restrictive means to achieve the goal of mitigating and slowing the spread of COVID-19. Accordingly, I hereby issue this Order **effective March 23, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.** within the jurisdictional limits of Indian Creek Village. This Emergency Order shall expire upon the expiration of the existing Indian Creek Village State of Emergency. This Emergency Order may be cancelled earlier by action of the Village Manager.
