# POLICE CHIEF

Indian Creek Village (ICV) is currently seeking an individual who is motivated, experienced and proactive to fill the Chief of Police position. The ideal candidate must be dedicated to casting a vision surrounding the safety and protection of all residents and visitors.

Indian Creek Village (ICV) is an exclusive, gated community located on a small island in the Intracoastal Waterway of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The Village is composed of 41 residential lots surrounding a golf course and a country club.

Safety and security are paramount to the residents and visitors of Indian Creek. One bridge, with a gatehouse, provides access to and from the Island, a marine patrol unit (as part of the ICV Police Department) as well as security cameras monitoring the activity surrounding the island 24/7/365.

Indian Creek Village Police Chief is a full-time position and operates under the general direction and supervision of the Village Manager. He/she will oversee nine (9) full-time police officers, three (3) part-time reserve officers, and four (4) full-time public safety aides.

The new Chief will be expected to review the Department to ensure it is operating efficiently and effectively as well as taking advantage of all appropriate modern technologies. He/she will possess a unique combination of expertise in policing and uncommonly high levels of sophistication, integrity, diplomacy and sensitivity. Applicants should have a college degree and ideally will be currently certified as a law enforcement officer in Florida. Graduation from the FBI Academy at Quantico, VA, is a significant plus.

Compensation will be between \$130,500 and \$165,000 and depend on qualifications. Benefits are excellent. The Police Chief is not expected to reside on the island.
